







Incident Objectives


1. **TESTING:** Develop community testing and point prevalence surveillance strategies in accordance with the Governor's priorities.
2. **CONTACT TRACING:** Develop a contact strategy to keep the rate of spread within the capability of existing healthcare capacity.
3. **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings in the community.
4. **EQUITY: EQUALITY AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** Ensure all operations are actively centered on and consider impacts to the most under resourced individuals and communities. Integrate, prioritize, measure, and validate equitable and ethical practices for all response and recovery decisions, actions, and resource allocation.
5. **SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and materials can meet an evolving demand environment.
6. **FEDERAL AID AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS:** Begin working with local governments and other eligible applicants for federal aid.
7. **SUSTAINMENT:** Prepare to maintain operations for the remainder of the year and respond to any secondary outbreaks and other emergencies.
8. **SAFETY:** Keep the citizens of the Commonwealth's health and safety and that of incident personnel a top priority in all decisions and actions.

ESF-8 Public Health and Medical Updates

- On July 1, Virginia entered Phase Three of the “Forward Virginia” plan to continue easing public health restrictions while mitigating the spread of COVID-19.
 - On June 30, Governor Northam [announced](#) that bar seating will remain prohibited in restaurants during Phase III.
 - Governor Northam continues to remind Virginians that they are safer at home, especially if they are high-risk or vulnerable. All Virginians must continue to comply with the statewide face covering requirement in indoor public spaces, & Virginians are strongly encouraged to:
 - continue teleworking if possible
 - wash hands regularly
 - maintain six feet of physical distance when outside of home
 - get tested immediately if you have COVID-19 symptoms

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**

- On June 29, HHS issued a [press release](#) regarding remdesivir availability. VDH is expecting one more allocation of the lyophilized vials to be received towards the latter part of the week. The allocation will be shipped by VDH Pharmacy Services on Monday, July 6. Future remdesivir will be available for hospitals directly from AmerisourceBergen to purchase via the Wholesale Acquisition Price, which amounts to approximately \$3,200 per treatment course. Vials will be allocated with shipping to occur every 2 weeks.

- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**


- Workgroup continues to ensure that case investigation, contact tracing, monitoring, point prevalence surveys, and public health and commercial laboratory testing efforts are expanded through additional staffing, resource acquisition, and public outreach and education.
- As of June 30, the Virginia National Guard has collected 69,241 test samples and completed 252 testing missions, including 213 point prevalence surveys and 39 community events.
- Local health districts are actively conducting community testing events across the state with a particular emphasis on reaching underserved, vulnerable and high-risk populations.
- Late next week, the containment team will begin holding tabletop exercises with Institutes of Higher Education on contact tracing in preparation for the coming school year.
- Federal contracts for testing with Rite Aid and Walmart, originally set to expire 6/30/20, have been extended.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Community Mitigation**
 - The VDH [website](#) continues to be maintained with guidance for schools, workplaces and other community settings.
 - Regional webinars to connect K-12 schools & local health departments to discuss reopening plans are being scheduled.
- **Governor's Long-Term Care Task Force**
 - The Veterans Health Administration teams continue to provide non-regulatory infection prevention and control assessments (IPCAs) in long-term care facilities.
 - On June 19, Governor Northam [announced](#) new guidelines and testing requirements for reopening long-term care facilities, and outlined how the Commonwealth will direct \$246 million, primarily from federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding, to support long-term care facilities in their response to COVID-19. DMAS is currently working on the process for payment of CARES Act funding to nursing homes and assisted living facilities.
 - VDH's state-specific [guidelines for nursing home reopening](#) are now available. The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) has developed [recommendations for assisted living facilities](#).
 - VDH is now releasing [facility-specific data](#) regarding COVID-19 cases and deaths associated with long-term care facilities.
 - The VDH tele-press conference on long-term care facilities has been rescheduled to Thursday, July 2 at 11 a.m. Within 24-hours of the press conference's conclusion, a copy of the MP3 audio file and transcript will be posted [online](#).

Total Cases by Date Reported



Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset






Cases by Age Group - Virginia












