



Event Summary:

- On May 31, 2020 Governor Northam declared a State of Emergency for the Commonwealth of Virginia in response to widespread First Amendment protests and civil unrest.
- The initial amount available for State Public Assistance (SPA) is written in the Executive Order.
- Grants and Recovery conducted five webinars to discuss the Cost Recovery process to submit damage assessments related to this event.
- There were approximately 250 attendees across all webinars
- There is event-specific website posted at <https://vaemergency.gov/first-amendment-june-2020>
- The event is ongoing as of June 10, 2020.
- The First Amendment Executive Order was extended for another 30 days.





Incident Objectives

- **TESTING:** Further develop and implement a sustainable infrastructure that supports public health and private sector SARS-CoV-2 testing strategies.
- **SURVEILLANCE AND INVESTIGATION:** Continue to conduct surveillance, case investigation and contact tracing to contain the spread of SARS-CoV-2.
- **COMMUNITY MITIGATION:** Based on review of public health data, continue to evaluate the need for implementation of community mitigation strategies (e.g. face coverings, physical distancing, etc.) in communities experiencing moderate-substantial community transmission. Continue to provide public health consultation on plans to implement risk mitigation strategies in community settings.
- **BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL HEALTH:** Develop and support strategies that mitigate the impact of stressors on the public and healthcare providers/first responders (i.e. deteriorating health of self, loved one, or patients; job loss; disruption in daily activities).
- **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings.
- **MEDICAL COUNTERMEASURES:** Develop a plan and prepare for the statewide distribution of and dispensing of COVID-19 vaccines (and /or other medical countermeasures, e.g. antivirals).
- **RESOURCE MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and services can meet an evolving demand environment. (i.e. new community spread or a second wave). Commence stockpiling of PPE, laboratory testing equipment, vaccination ancillary supplies and/or other medical goods for future response.
- **PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:** Develop and implement appropriate communications and media campaign strategies to inform the response of partners and the general public (i.e. provider training, business planning, getting tested, wearing a mask/social distancing, and vaccination).
- **OPERATIONAL FLEXIBILITY:** Be prepared to respond simultaneously to additional threats to include hurricanes and other weather related events in the SARS-CoV-2 environment.
- **RECOVERY:** Return economic, employment and business activities to a healthy state and restore and improve health and social services capabilities and networks to promote the resilience, independence, health (including behavioral health), and well-being of the whole community.

Healthcare Coordination

- Office of Emergency Medical Services is providing updated information on PPE resources, PPE management, and PPE accessibility through vendor and Virginia supply chains. Reviewing guidance and providing information on EMS providers as vaccinators and testers.
- The Acute Care/Med Surge Committee met on 8/31 to continue discussions around the ongoing response to COVID-19. Representatives from VDH and Virginia's hospitals discussed the vaccination efforts, new long-term care guidance, PPE, testing, and other aspects of the response.
- The Long-Term Care Task Force meeting is being held on 9/4. Topics being covered are: 1) VDH's recent clinician letter to nursing homes; 2) CARES Act funding check in; 3) behavioral health in long-term care facilities; 4) Virginia National Guard; 5) CMS testing requirements for certified nursing homes; and 6) 2020 General Assembly August Special Session Update.
- The Virginia National Guard plans to resume support for Virginia's COVID-19 response in early September with approximately 85 Soldiers and Airmen conducting COVID-19 sample test collection and training on the proper fit and wear of personal protective equipment. They began mobilizing Sept. 1, 2020, for training and administrative tasks, and they expect to begin operations by Sept. 8. The VaNG will also provide regional planners.
- The Testing team continues to recruit for regional testing strike teams to integrate testing team efforts and strategies within the developing VDH containment support center framework.
- Two new high throughput machines are being installed at DCLS. Lab capacity may double as a result
- The Pharmacy subcommittee discussed how and if the PREP Act amendment supersedes Virginia law. Board of Pharmacy has requested counsel and will coordinate distributing information once more is available. The group is interested in seeing any state additional requirements, including education, training and reporting. Board of Pharmacy is working with SHHR post-Counsel review and developing guidance and whether there will need to be any emergency regulations promulgated.
- On 8/28/20, the FDA EUA broadened use of remdesivir to all hospitalized pediatric and adult patients irrespective of disease severity. Clinical trials are starting for remdesivir to be used as an ambulatory infusion for 3 days for mild COVID-19.

Public Health Surveillance and Guidance

- The Vaccination Unit is actively developing plans and preparing for the statewide distribution and dispensing of anticipated COVID-19 vaccines in collaboration with CDC and other Federal partners. A statewide influenza vaccination campaign is also being planned.
- A draft single system portal for DOLI/business outbreak reporting is in development. The draft portal was presented on 9/3 to interested parties. The targeted launch date for the portal is 9/14.
- The Investigation team is developing a process and criteria to identify when cases are exceeding a district's capacity to investigate.
- CDC Fellows have been placed in contact tracing roles in Virginia Beach and Alexandria health districts.
- A non-essential worker workplace testing decision tree has been developed and was sent for approval on 9/2. Guidance for indoor testing is still in development.

Community Mitigation

- The VDH website continues to be updated and maintained with [guidance for schools, workplaces and other community locations](#).
- The workgroup continues to collaborate with other workgroups, the Governor's Office and community stakeholders to develop guidance for reinstating community mitigation measures.






Total Cases Per 100K by County




Growth in Cases Per 100k (8/27-9/2)

Top Counties Sorted: 7-Day Average New Cases Per 100k






7-Day Positivity Rate by Health District

Quick Facts

- Virginia's 7-day positivity rate of **7.6%** is **1.9 percentage points** above the national average of **5.7%**.
- **74%** of Health Districts (26 of 35) are meeting the absolute goal of 7-day positivity rate less than 10%
- **5** Districts have positivity rates below 5%, and the Health District with the lowest 7-day positivity rate is **Eastern Shore (2.5%)**
- **9** Districts have positivity rates above 10%, and the Health District with the highest 7-day positivity rate is **New River (14.4%)**
- **Central Shenandoah** and **New River** saw large spikes in positivity rates in the last week, from 6.2% to 13.5% and 3.7% to 14.4%, respectively.



Districts with 7-Day Positivity Rate under 5%




Districts with 7-Day Positivity Rate over 10%







Cumulative Outbreaks



LTCF Outbreaks in Progress




Percent of cases in VA that are outbreak related

Localities with the Most LTCF Outbreaks in Progress








Total Cases by Date Reported - Virginia

Number of new deaths VDH reported by day.




Cases by Age Group - Virginia




