





Incident Objectives

1. **PUBLIC HEALTH SURVEILLANCE:** Current Surveillance (identify cases) of COVID - 19, to include the development of tracking tools and dashboards of Virginia.
2. **CONTAINMENT:** Identifying cases early and isolating them; conduct contact tracing and quarantine them.
3. **COMMUNITY MITIGATION:** Implement social distancing strategies to prevent spread.
4. **COORDINATE HEALTHCARE SERVICES.**
5. **COMMUNICATIONS:** Communicate to the public, business community, and state employees in a transparent and consistent means across state government.
6. **PLANNING:** Review, assess, and develop contingency plans for
 - a) Medical Supplies and PPE
 - b) Medical Surge
 - c) Telework
 - d) Trigger points for (A) public health emergency requiring quarantine or isolation; (B) state emergency declaration; and (C) limitations on mass gatherings, schools, and/or transportation.
 - e) COOP & COG
7. **TRAINING, EDUCATION and EXERCISE:** Identify and provide training, education and exercise materials to state employees and response partners.
8. **POLICY GUIDANCE:** Provide consistent policy guidance across state government.
9. **COSTS:** Track financial costs for COVID – 19
10. **WORKFORCE HEALTH and SAFETY:** establish appropriate measures for the safety and wellness of state workforce.

COVID-19 Organizational Chart




ESF-8 Public Health & Medical Updates

- VHHA and VDH have [announced](#) a new initiative to support and provide resources to long-term care facilities, including: infection prevention and control education and training; access to PPE and other medical supplies, including guidance and training on appropriate reprocessing and use of protective gear; access to COVID-19 testing and testing supplies; clinical practice and communication support; staffing support; and sharing of best practices and lessons learned by other health care organizations.
- On 5/7, the State Health Commissioner sent a [Clinician Letter](#) to healthcare providers in Virginia to provide updates on testing, VDH's online morbidity reporting portal, and the importance of prompt cause of death certification.


Total Cases by Date Reported

Number of new cases VDH reported by day.




Total Deaths by Date Reported

Number of new deaths VDH reported by day.




Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset

Number of cases by the day closest to when symptoms began.




Number of Deaths by Date of Death

Number of deaths by the day of death as written on the death certificate.








Cases by Sex - Virginia





COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**
 - The Healthcare Coordination committee continues to meet on a weekly basis, focusing on various strategies regarding medical surge, EMS needs, pharmacy services/drug shortages, provider wellness, and opportunities to expand telehealth.
- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**
 - Guidance for the public, healthcare providers and local health departments continues to be developed and maintained.
 - Planning and coordination is ongoing in order to surge contact tracing capacity in Virginia.
- **Community Mitigation**
 - Guidance is being developed for various business and community sectors as the plan to reopen Virginia is considered.
 - More detailed guidance for Phase 1 of the Forward Virginia blueprint will be provided by the Governor on Friday.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Testing Capacity & Coordination**
 - The Virginia National Guard is actively deploying and supporting testing missions at congregate and community settings throughout the state.
 - Contracts with two commercial labs have been established to provide 30,000 total collection kits and lab processing, with weekly deliveries starting 5/11.
- **Provider Outreach & Detailing**
 - The MRC continues to recruit and deploy medical and non-medical volunteers to bolster the work of local health departments, hospitals, and healthcare providers.
 - Infographics and training videos are being developed for providers to use for collecting test specimens.
 - A contract to deploy a forward tracing tool has been finalized.



