





Incident Objectives


1. **TESTING:** Develop community testing and point prevalence surveillance strategies in accordance with the Governor's priorities.
2. **CONTACT TRACING:** Develop a contact strategy to keep the rate of spread within the capability of existing healthcare capacity.
3. **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings in the community.
4. **EQUITY: EQUALITY AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** Ensure all operations are actively centered on and consider impacts to the most under resourced individuals and communities. Integrate, prioritize, measure, and validate equitable and ethical practices for all response and recovery decisions, actions, and resource allocation.
5. **SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and materials can meet an evolving demand environment.
6. **FEDERAL AID AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS:** Begin working with local governments and other eligible applicants for federal aid.
7. **SUSTAINMENT:** Prepare to maintain operations for the remainder of the year and respond to any secondary outbreaks and other emergencies.
8. **SAFETY:** Keep the citizens of the Commonwealth's health and safety and that of incident personnel a top priority in all decisions and actions.

ESF-8 Public Health and Medical Updates

- On July 10, The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) announced the agency's plans to deploy [Quality Improvement Contractors](#) across the country to provide immediate assistance to nursing homes in the hotspot areas as identified by the White House Coronavirus Task Force. In addition, the agency is implementing an enhanced survey process to meet the specific concerns of hotspot areas and will coordinate federal, state and local efforts to leverage all available resources to these facilities.
- On July 10, the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) published their [Contact Tracing Dashboard](#). The dashboard includes:
 - Percent of cases (individuals diagnosed with COVID-19) reached within 24 hours
 - Number of contacts of cases who are undergoing public health monitoring
 - Of contacts reached, percent contacted within 24 hours
 - Percent of contacts that — after multiple attempts — were unable to be reached or have yet to be reachedThe data will be updated weekly on Fridays.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates


- **Healthcare Coordination**
 - Efforts continue to further expand pharmacy-based testing capacity. Pharmacy reimbursement for testing is being addressed with insurers and other stakeholders.
 - DMAS has contracted a vendor to process payments for COVID-19 testing in Assisted Living and Nursing Facilities.
 - The Provider Wellness subgroup's [Frontline Wellness VA](#) website is live to provide support and resources for healthcare workers during the COVID-19 response.
- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**
 - Workgroup continues to ensure that case investigation, contact tracing, monitoring, point prevalence surveys, and public health and commercial laboratory testing efforts are expanded through additional staffing, resource acquisition, and public outreach and education.
 - As of July 9, the Virginia National Guard has collected 85,787 test samples and completed 321 testing missions, including 297 point prevalence surveys and 44 community events.
 - Local health districts are actively conducting community testing events across the state with a particular emphasis on reaching underserved, vulnerable and high-risk populations.
 - Federal contracts for testing with Rite Aid and Walmart, originally set to expire 6/30/20, have been extended.
 - The layout of the [VDH COVID-19 Home](#) page has been updated to feature icons that improve usability and access.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Community Mitigation**
 - The VDH [website](#) continues to be maintained with guidance for schools, workplaces and other community settings.
 - Regional webinars to connect K-12 schools & local health departments to discuss reopening plans were held in Northern, Northwest, Eastern, Southwest, and Central Regions this week.
 - The Workgroup wrote FAQs to accompany Phase 3 Guidelines. The FAQs will be published to the Governor's Website.
- **Governor's Long-Term Care Task Force**
 - The Veterans Health Administration teams continue to provide non-regulatory infection prevention and control assessments (IPCAs) in long-term care facilities.
 - [FAQs for nursing home phased reopening](#) were posted on July 3rd.
 - VDH's state-specific [guidelines for nursing home reopening](#) are now available. The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) has developed [recommendations for assisted living facilities](#).
 - VDH is now releasing [facility-specific data](#) regarding COVID-19 cases and deaths associated with long-term care facilities.
 - With flu season and hurricane season approaching, Task Force membership are preparing for discussions to ensure that emergency preparedness and response as well as vaccine planning align with COVID-19 infection control recommendations.

Total Cases by Date Reported



Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset






Cases by Age Group - Virginia


Cases by Sex - Virginia

Total Deaths by Date Reported



Number of Deaths by Date of Death






Deaths by Age Group - Virginia






