



# Incident Objectives


1. **TESTING:** Develop community testing and point prevalence surveillance strategies in accordance with the Governor's priorities.
2. **CONTACT TRACING:** Develop a contact strategy to keep the rate of spread within the capability of existing healthcare capacity.
3. **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings in the community..
4. **EQUITY: EQUALITY AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** Ensure all operations are actively centered on and consider impacts to the most under resourced individuals and communities. Integrate, prioritize, measure, and validate equitable and ethical practices for all response and recovery decisions, actions, and resource allocation.
5. **SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and materials can meet an evolving demand environment.
6. **FEDERAL AID AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS:** Begin working with local governments and other eligible applicants for federal aid.
7. **SUSTAINMENT:** Prepare to maintain operations for the remainder of the year and respond to any secondary outbreaks and other emergencies.
8. **Safety:** Keep the citizens of the Commonwealth's health and safety and that of incident personnel a top priority in all decisions and actions.

# ESF-8 Public Health and Medical Updates

- [Governor Northam has issued Amended Executive Order Sixty-Five and Amended Order of Public Health Emergency Six, allowing Northern Virginia and the City of Richmond to enter Phase Two](#) starting at midnight on Thursday, June 11.
- On June 9, Governor Northam [announced](#) a phased approach that allows Virginia schools to slowly resume in-person classes for summer school and the coming academic year. The PreK-12 guidance is aligned with the phases outlined in the [Forward Virginia](#) blueprint and provides opportunities for school divisions to begin offering in-person instruction to specific student groups.
  - Beginning with Phase Two, local divisions and private schools must submit plans to the Virginia Department of Education that include policies and procedures for implementing VDH and CDC [mitigation strategies](#). [The State Health Commissioner has issued an Order of Public Health Emergency that requires all Virginia PreK-12 public and private schools to develop plans that demonstrate adherence to public health guidance.](#)

# COVID-19 Workgroup Updates


- **Healthcare Coordination**
  - Efforts continue to expand testing within community pharmacies.
  - Remdesivir continues to be received from HHS and distributed through the VDH Division of Pharmacy Services in accordance with the distribution plan.
- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**
  - Workgroup continues to ensure that case investigation, contact tracing, monitoring, point prevalence surveys, and public health and commercial laboratory testing efforts are expanded through additional staffing, resource acquisition, and public outreach and education.
  - Efforts continue to improve case investigation and contact tracing efforts by recruiting additional staff, adjusting policies, and developing a marketing campaign to encourage public compliance.
  - Contact tracer recruitment efforts are ongoing. Position descriptions and guidelines for applying are available on the [VDH website](#).
  - LTCFs may now request lowering restrictions at their facility (granted they meet established criteria) through their local health department by completing a REDCap survey.

# COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Governor's Long-Term Care Task Force**
  - Point Prevalence Surveys (PPS) are being conducted at long-term care facilities to test all residents and staff, regardless of whether symptoms are being displayed or not.
  - To date, the state has partnered with the National Guard to conduct 84 Point Prevalence Surveys at long-term care facilities.
  - The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has released guidance and recommendations pertaining to the phased reopening of nursing homes, which is guided by baseline and regular testing of all residents and staff.
  - The guidance document for Virginia's phased reopening and testing processes for long-term care facilities is being reviewed by the Governor's office.

### Total Cases by Date Reported


Number of new cases VDH reported by day.



### Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset


Number of cases by the day closest to when symptoms began.



### Total Deaths by Date Reported


Number of new deaths VDH reported by day.



### Number of Deaths by Date of Death




### Deaths by Age Group - Virginia


### Deaths by Race - Virginia
