





Incident Objectives

1. **PUBLIC HEALTH SURVEILLANCE:** Current Surveillance (identify cases) of COVID - 19, to include the development of tracking tools and dashboards of Virginia.
2. **CONTAINMENT:** Identifying cases early and isolating them; conduct contact tracing and quarantine them.
3. **COMMUNITY MITIGATION:** Implement social distancing strategies to prevent spread.
4. **COORDINATE HEALTHCARE SERVICES.**
5. **COMMUNICATIONS:** Communicate to the public, business community, and state employees in a transparent and consistent means across state government.
6. **PLANNING:** Review, assess, and develop contingency plans for
 - a) Medical Supplies and PPE
 - b) Medical Surge
 - c) Telework
 - d) Trigger points for (A) public health emergency requiring quarantine or isolation; (B) state emergency declaration; and (C) limitations on mass gatherings, schools, and/or transportation.
 - e) COOP & COG
7. **TRAINING, EDUCATION and EXERCISE:** Identify and provide training, education and exercise materials to state employees and response partners.
8. **POLICY GUIDANCE:** Provide consistent policy guidance across state government.
9. **COSTS:** Track financial costs for COVID – 19
10. **WORKFORCE HEALTH and SAFETY:** establish appropriate measures for the safety and wellness of state workforce.

COVID-19 Organizational Chart




ESF-8 Public Health & Medical Updates

- The number of cases of COVID-19 being reported in the United States is rising quickly.
 - This increase is expected given an increase in testing and ongoing rapid spread of disease across communities in the United States.
 - While these numbers are concerning, the increase is not unexpected.
 - More robust data will allow CDC and VDH to better understand and track the size and scope of the disease and strengthen prevention and response efforts.


Total Cases by Date Reported

Number of new cases VDH reported by day.




Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset





Number of Deaths by Date of Death











COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**
 - A workgroup has been established to develop guidance and a distribution strategy for remdesivir, a drug with FDA emergency use authorization for the treatment of suspected or laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 in adults and children hospitalized with severe disease.
 - The Virginia Office of EMS announced it has cancelled the 2020 Virginia EMS Symposium, originally scheduled for November 11-15 in Norfolk.
- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**
 - Guidance continues to be developed for healthcare providers, local health departments and the general public.
 - The Poultry Plant Support Workgroup continues to collaborate with local health departments, federal agencies and public health officials in Maryland and Delaware to respond to outbreaks in these settings.
- **Community Mitigation**
 - Guidance continues to be developed for various business and community sectors for Phase 1 of the Forward Virginia plan.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Testing Capacity & Coordination**
 - Testing capacity continues to increase with recent agreements with commercial laboratories. Two of these contracts will provide lab processing services and 30,000 collection kits with weekly deliveries commencing 5/11/20.
- **Provider Outreach & Detailing**
 - The Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) continues to recruit and deploy medical and non-medical volunteers to bolster the work of local health departments, hospitals, and healthcare providers.



