





Incident Objectives

(updated 5/13)

1. **TESTING:** Develop community testing and point prevalence surveillance strategies in accordance with the Governor's priorities.
2. **CONTACT TRACING:** Develop a contact strategy to keep the rate of spread within the capability of existing healthcare capacity.
3. **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings in the community..
4. **EQUITY: EQUALITY AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** Ensure all operations are actively centered on and consider impacts to the most under resourced individuals and communities. Integrate, prioritize, measure, and validate equitable and ethical practices for all response and recovery decisions, actions, and resource allocation.
5. **SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and materials can meet an evolving demand environment.
6. **FEDERAL AID AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS:** Begin working with local governments and other eligible applicants for federal aid.
7. **SUSTAINMENT:** Prepare to maintain operations for the remainder of the year and respond to any secondary outbreaks and other emergencies.

COVID-19 Organizational Chart






Total Cases by Date Reported

Number of new cases VDH reported by day.




Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset

Number of cases by the day closest to when symptoms began.









Total Deaths by Date Reported



Number of Deaths by Date of Death




Deaths by Age Group - Virginia







COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**

- The Commonwealth has received a very limited supply of remdesivir from HHS. VDH is working with VHHA to identify hospitals that are able to use remdesivir doses provided in accordance with the FDA Emergency Use Authorization issued on May 1. An allocation process is in the final stages of development with the goal to have distribution of this initial small allotment provided to the hospitals this week. More communication to hospitals/health systems will be coming from VDH and VHHA.

- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**

- CDC is working on a Health Alert Network (HAN) advisory about pediatric multi-system inflammatory syndrome potentially associated with COVID-19. The timing of the advisory is not known. CDC and CSTE are discussing a standardized case definition.

- **Community Mitigation**

- Guidance continues to be developed for various business sectors, communities and congregate settings around implementing non-pharmaceutical interventions.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Testing Capacity & Coordination**
 - A process to provide resources (test collection kits, PPE) to free clinics that are willing to conduct COVID-19 testing at their facilities is being finalized.
 - Communication continues with commercial pharmacy chains concerning partnership in conducting testing as well as vaccine dispensing when vaccine becomes available.
- **Provider Outreach & Detailing**
 - The Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) continues to recruit and deploy medical and non-medical volunteers to bolster the work of local health departments, hospitals, and healthcare providers.
