





## Event Summary:

- On May 31, 2020 Governor Northam declared a State of Emergency for the Commonwealth of Virginia in response to widespread First Amendment protests and civil unrest.
- The initial amount available for State Public Assistance (SPA) is written in the Executive Order.
- Grants and Recovery conducted five webinars to discuss the Cost Recovery process to submit damage assessments related to this event.
- There were approximately 250 attendees across all webinars
- There is event-specific website posted at <https://vaemergency.gov/first-amendment-june-2020>
- The event is ongoing as of June 10, 2020.
- The First Amendment Executive Order was extended for another 30 days.








Hospitalized Cases (Confirmed & Pending) & Bed Counts Over Time



# *Incident Objectives*

- **TESTING:** Further develop and implement a sustainable infrastructure that supports public health and private sector SARS-CoV-2 testing strategies.
- **SURVEILLANCE AND INVESTIGATION:** Continue to conduct surveillance, case investigation and contact tracing to contain the spread of SARS-CoV-2.
- **COMMUNITY MITIGATION:** Based on review of public health data, continue to evaluate the need for implementation of community mitigation strategies (e.g. face coverings, physical distancing, etc.) in communities experiencing moderate-substantial community transmission. Continue to provide public health consultation on plans to implement risk mitigation strategies in community settings.
- **BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL HEALTH:** Develop and support strategies that mitigate the impact of stressors on the public and healthcare providers/first responders (i.e. deteriorating health of self, loved one, or patients; job loss; disruption in daily activities).
- **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings.
- **MEDICAL COUNTERMEASURES:** Develop a plan and prepare for the statewide distribution of and dispensing of COVID-19 vaccines (and /or other medical countermeasures, e.g. antivirals).
- **RESOURCE MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and services can meet an evolving demand environment. (i.e. new community spread or a second wave). Commence stockpiling of PPE, laboratory testing equipment, vaccination ancillary supplies and/or other medical goods for future response.
- **PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:** Develop and implement appropriate communications and media campaign strategies to inform the response of partners and the general public (i.e. provider training, business planning, getting tested, wearing a mask/social distancing, and vaccination).
- **OPERATIONAL FLEXIBILITY:** Be prepared to respond simultaneously to additional threats to include hurricanes and other weather related events in the SARS-CoV-2 environment.
- **RECOVERY:** Return economic, employment and business activities to a healthy state and restore and improve health and social services capabilities and networks to promote the resilience, independence, health (including behavioral health), and well-being of the whole community.

## Healthcare Coordination

- On 8/18, Governor Northam issued [Executive Order Seventy](#) to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19 at Virginia's state-operated psychiatric hospitals and ensure the safety of patients and staff during the ongoing health crisis.
- Emergency Medical Services Workgroup is providing updated information on PPE resources, PPE management, and PPE accessibility through vendor and Virginia supply chains.
- There were 751 MRC volunteer deployments August 10 – 16. There have been a total of 18,819 MRC volunteer deployments since March 16, 2020.
- The Testing Team is in the process of recruiting 3 regional strike teams to support localities. These strike teams will work collaboratively with the Regional Containments and are projected to be recruited and operational by early September.
- The Virginia National Guard is remobilizing and are slated to be operational by early September to assist with PPS testing.
- The Testing Advisory Council (TAC) has focused multiple discussion on the applicability of antigen testing; updated guidance is expected from the CDC which will share VDH guidance along with TAC input.
- Testing per day as well as disease rates are trending downward for most of Virginia.
- The Long-Term Care Task Force held its biweekly meeting on 8/20/2020. Key topics addressed included are 1) COVID-19 and Influenza Vaccine Planning; 2) Testing; 3) PPE Needs as Reported by Long-Term Care Facilities; 4) Financing Guidance Provided by DMAS; 5) Compliance with Virginia Department of Labor and Industry Emergency Temporary Standards for Infectious Disease Prevention; and 6) a 2020 General Assembly August Special Session Update.
- VDH is anticipating an announcement from CMS requiring certified nursing homes to test staff regularly based on positivity rates in the county or city within which a facility operates.
- The COVID-19 Testing Site Map is now filterable by two new criteria: Sites offering testing free of charge, and sites offering screening and/or testing services to pediatric patients.
- The Virginia Team to help to lead efforts on the Governor's Multi-State Group Purchasing Agreement for Point of Care Testing has been defined. Representatives are from VDH, DMAS, VDEM, DGS, and the Testing Advisory Council.

## Public Health Surveillance and Guidance

- The Vaccination Unit is actively developing plans and preparing for the statewide distribution and dispensing of anticipated COVID-19 vaccines in collaboration with CDC and other Federal partners. A statewide influenza vaccination campaign is also being planned.
- The Surveillance Unit is incorporating the new CSTE case definition into algorithms for businesses. They are also developing surveillance systems for schools and for children not in school full-time, but engaging in extracurricular activities.
- The Containment Unit is conducting trainings with contact tracing staff on how to address social and cultural barriers to isolation and quarantine.
- The Investigation Unit is coordinating with DBHDS and correctional facilities to discuss infection control and testing among residents, incarcerated individuals, and staff.
- The Health Information Unit is revising the K-12 decision tree to focus on schools. They are also working to host the Disease Control Manual (DCM) on a external site via COV log-in.

## Community Mitigation

- The VDH website continues to be updated and maintained with [guidance for schools, workplaces and other community locations](#).
- The workgroup continues to collaborate with other workgroups, the Governor's Office and community stakeholders to develop guidance for reinstating community mitigation measures.






### Total Cases Per 100K by County




### Growth in Cases Per 100k (8/13-8/19)

### Top Counties Sorted: 7-Day Average New Cases Per 100k






## Quick Facts

- Virginia’s 7-day positivity rate of **6.6%** is 0.1 percentage point above the national average of **6.5%**.
- **83%** of Health Districts (29 of 35) are meeting the absolute goal of 7-day positivity rate less than 10%.
- Five Districts have positivity rates below 5%, and the Health District with the lowest 7-day positivity rate is **Eastern Shore (2.7%)**.
- Six Districts have positivity rates above 10%, and the Health District with the highest 7-day positivity rate is **West Piedmont (16.7%)**
- The positivity rate in the **Lenowisco** dropped 8 percentages points to 11%, down from 19% last week.


## 7-Day Positivity Rate by Health District



### Districts with 7-Day Positivity Rate under 5%





### Districts with 7-Day Positivity Rate over 10%





## Cumulative Outbreaks




Percent of cases in VA that are outbreak related




Percent of healthcare worker cases in VA

### Localities with the Most LTCF Outbreaks in Progress







Number of new cases VDH reported by day.




### Total Deaths by Date Reported - Virginia

Number of new deaths VDH reported by day.




### Cases by Age Group - Virginia






