# Incident Objectives


- **TESTING:** Further develop and implement a sustainable infrastructure that supports public health and private sector SARS-CoV-2 testing strategies.
- **SURVEILLANCE AND INVESTIGATION:** Continue to conduct surveillance, case investigation and contact tracing to contain the spread of SARS-CoV-2.
- **COMMUNITY MITIGATION:** Based on review of public health data, continue to evaluate the need for implementation of community mitigation strategies (e.g. face coverings, physical distancing, etc.) in communities experiencing moderate-substantial community transmission. Continue to provide public health consultation on plans to implement risk mitigation strategies in community settings.
- **BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL HEALTH:** Develop and support strategies that mitigate the impact of stressors on the public and healthcare providers/first responders (i.e. deteriorating health of self, loved one, or patients; job loss; disruption in daily activities).
- **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings.
- **MEDICAL COUNTERMEASURES:** Develop a plan and prepare for the statewide distribution of and dispensing of COVID-19 vaccines (and /or other medical countermeasures, e.g. antivirals).
- **RESOURCE MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and services can meet an evolving demand environment. (i.e. new community spread or a second wave). Commence stockpiling of PPE, laboratory testing equipment, vaccination ancillary supplies and/or other medical goods for future response.
- **PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:** Develop and implement appropriate communications and media campaign strategies to inform the response of partners and the general public (i.e. provider training, business planning, getting tested, wearing a mask/social distancing, and vaccination).
- **OPERATIONAL FLEXIBILITY:** Be prepared to respond simultaneously to additional threats to include hurricanes and other weather related events in the SARS-CoV-2 environment.
- **RECOVERY:** Return economic, employment and business activities to a healthy state and restore and improve health and social services capabilities and networks to promote the resilience, independence, health (including behavioral health), and well-being of the whole community.





# ESF-8 Public Health and Medical Updates

- On July 14, Governor Northam announced stepped up enforcement of guidelines and restrictions as cases in the Hampton Roads area increase. To increase enforcement of existing restrictions in restaurants and other places where people gather, the Governor has directed teams made up of members from the health departments, the Virginia ABC, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and other licensing agencies to conduct unannounced visits to establishments as needed.
- On July 15, Governor Northam [announced](#) the adoption of statewide emergency workplace safety standards in response to COVID-19. These first-in-the-nation safety rules will protect Virginia workers by mandating appropriate personal protective equipment, sanitization, social distancing, infectious disease preparedness and response plans, record keeping, training, and hazard communications in workplaces across the Commonwealth.
- On July 15, Governor Northam also [announced](#) that the Virginia Department of Health and University of Virginia have partnered to collect COVID-19 health data to support clinical research. The Integrated Translational Health Institute of Virginia (iTHRIV), in close collaboration with VDH has developed an [online tool](#) to collect COVID-19 related information from volunteers who are residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

# COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**

- The Testing Unit and Testing Advisory Council are collaborating to refine testing strategies and continue to look for opportunities to build new capacity for lab testing in an effort to improve testing turnaround times.
- To date, the state has scheduled, completed, or is somewhere in the execution process to complete 380 Point Prevalence Surveys at long-term care facilities in partnership with the Virginia National Guard.
- The Veterans Health Administration teams continue to provide non-regulatory infection prevention and control assessments (IPCAs) in long-term care facilities.

- **Community Mitigation**

- The VDH [website](#) continues to be maintained with guidance for schools, workplaces and other community settings.
- Providing recommendations and support to Eastern Region to reinstate mitigation measures due to the current spike in cases.
- Held regional webinars with Northern, Northwest, Eastern, Southwest, and Central regions between school districts and local health departments to discuss reopening plans.

# COVID-19 Workgroup Updates


- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**

- Workgroup continues to ensure that case investigation, contact tracing, monitoring, point prevalence surveys, and public health and commercial laboratory testing efforts are expanded through additional staffing, resource acquisition, and public outreach and education. These metrics and actions are being closely monitored in the consideration of reinstatement of community mitigation measures.
- An HHS-led COVID-19 Rapid Assistance Field Team (CRAFT) mission will be conducted in the Eastern Region this week. The purpose of the CRAFT mission is to leverage ground truth to validate data of what is happening in hot spot areas, meet with community groups to determine possible root causes, and assist State, Local, Tribal, and Territory leaders in designing a plan of action that will immediately reduce the impact of the virus. Federal on-site and virtual team members include representatives from ASPR, OASH, CDC, and FEMA. On-site team members arrived Monday and will be departing Friday.
- Virginia's [Key Measures Dashboard](#) includes COVID-19 case, hospital and testing measures used to monitor the COVID-19 health emergency in Virginia. Previously, VDH only provided statewide and Northern Region key measures; data are now provided for all regions in the state.

■ 7-day Moving Average




### Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset - Virginia

Number of cases by the day closest to when symptoms began.






### Cases by Age Group - Virginia


### Cases by Sex - Virginia


### Number of Deaths by Date of Death - Virginia

Number of deaths by the day of death as written on the death certificate




### Total Deaths by Date Reported - Virginia

Number of new deaths VDH reported by day.






