







Incident Objectives

1. **TESTING:** Develop community testing and point prevalence surveillance strategies in accordance with the Governor's priorities.
2. **CONTACT TRACING:** Develop a contact strategy to keep the rate of spread within the capability of existing healthcare capacity.
3. **MEDICAL SURGE:** Continue to support and refine medical surge plans in collaboration with hospitals, long-term care facilities, correctional facilities and other congregate settings in the community..
4. **EQUITY: EQUALITY AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** Ensure all operations are actively centered on and consider impacts to the most under resourced individuals and communities. Integrate, prioritize, measure, and validate equitable and ethical practices for all response and recovery decisions, actions, and resource allocation.
5. **SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT:** Maintain and adapt strategies to ensure supplies of goods and materials can meet an evolving demand environment.
6. **FEDERAL AID AND RECOVERY PROGRAMS:** Begin working with local governments and other eligible applicants for federal aid.
7. **SUSTAINMENT:** Prepare to maintain operations for the remainder of the year and respond to any secondary outbreaks and other emergencies.

COVID-19 Organizational Chart




ESF-8 Public Health & Medical Updates

- On May 28, Governor Northam announced that Virginia’s public beaches and racetracks will be able to re-open on a limited basis, starting May 29. Public beaches had been restricted to fishing and exercise only. They will be allowed to open to other recreational activities, but social distancing and cleaning will be required. Other restrictions include no gatherings of more than ten people, no tents, no alcohol, and no group sports.
 - Governor Northam also announced that race tracks, including NASCAR, other vehicle racing, and horse tracks, will be allowed to run single-day events, under strict guidelines. Race events cannot be open to the public, and no spectators will be allowed.
 - Detailed guidance on restrictions for beaches and race tracks can be found in the [Amended Executive Order 61 and Order of Public Health Emergency 3](#).
- Governor Northam also announced a new partnership with [CVS Health](#) to open 39 new testing sites at drive-thru locations across the Commonwealth, beginning May 29.



Confirmed Cases by Date of Symptom Onset









Number of Deaths by Date of Death











COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Healthcare Coordination**
 - A new [website](#) is now available as a resource for frontline healthcare workers and support staff.
- **Public Health Surveillance & Guidance**
 - Workgroup continues to ensure that case investigation, contact tracing, monitoring, point prevalence surveys, and public health and commercial laboratory testing efforts are expanded through additional staffing, resource acquisition, and public outreach and education.
 - As of May 27, the Virginia National Guard has completed 48 point prevalence surveys (PPS) and 13 community testing events for a total of 23,804 tests. An additional 13 PPS and 5 community events are scheduled to occur May 28-30.
 - A partnership with Virginia Community Healthcare Association has increased testing capacity at Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs). 31 FQHCs are currently offering testing, with plans for an additional 37 to start.
 - The Sara Alert Contact Tracing System is now live statewide.
 - A new COVID-like Illness (CLI) Dashboard is now available on the VDH [website](#).
- **Community Mitigation**
 - Guidance continues to be developed for various business sectors, communities and congregate settings around implementing non-pharmaceutical interventions.

COVID-19 Workgroup Updates

- **Governor's Long-Term Care Task Force**
 - The Task Force convenes weekly to discuss staffing, financing, and testing needs. In addition, regular care transitions, communications, and provider specific work groups meet biweekly and a Task Force Steering Committee comprised of state agency leadership meets weekly.
 - Point Prevalence Surveys (PPS) are being conducted at long-term care facilities to test all residents and staff, regardless of whether symptoms are being displayed or not.
 - In response to recent CMS guidance on testing and reopening long-term care facilities, the Task Force is working on clear and concise guidance for Virginia's long-term care facilities to implement such testing recommendations and begin phased reopening.
 - To date, the Task Force has developed a plethora of guidance for Virginia's long-term care facilities in addition to a playbook to support facilities' response efforts. These materials can be accessed on the [Task Force's website](#).
