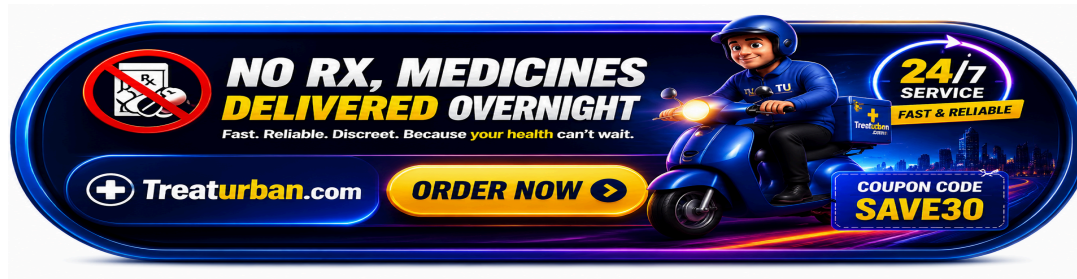

- Have asthma or other breathing disorders.
