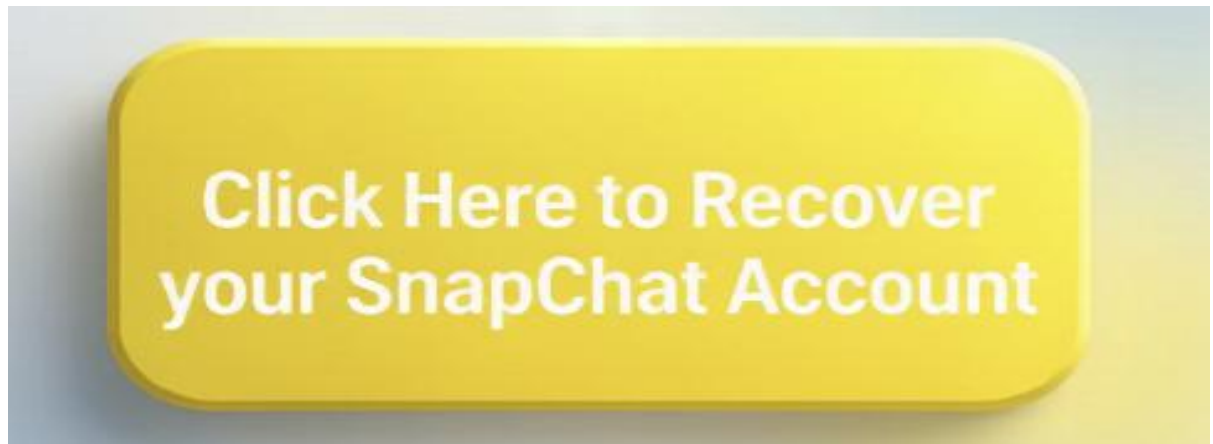


Snapchat Hacking (New Tips And Tricks) #1 [XCM85DG]
